

Oh deer! Did you know guns can kill your sense of hearing?



Did you know that if you're a hunter, you're pumping more than 100 decibels down the ear canal each time you pull the trigger?

Even if you're a game hunter firing a single round a season, hearing protection is critical. That's because sound damage is cumulative. The more big booms you're exposed to in your life, the more damage.

Now consider that while a deer hunter may fire only 10 shots in a season, a skeet shooter may be exposed to as many as 100 concussive booms per outing.

Loud noise, such as a rifle or shotgun blast, can irreparably traumatize the specialized inner-ear hair cells that enable us to hear. Once damaged, they can't be repaired. For that reason, it's imperative to use proper ear protection.

Noise exposure remains the most common preventable cause of irreversible hearing loss. Do you have a history of noise exposure? If so, call **(205) 313-0395** and ask to have your hearing tested today and be sure to ask about hearing noise protection.
